### **Background**

Florian trained as a medical doctor and Medical Specialist (Internist) in Germany. He got his Dr. med (PhD) from the University of Düsseldorf. He worked in Clinical Medicine in Germany, Tanzania, and Malawi and also in Epidemiology in Germany. He joined the Institute of Public Health at Heidelberg University (formerly Department of Tropical Hygiene and Public Health) in 2005. He chairs the branch "Universal Access" of the German AIDS Society since 2010.

### **Teaching**

Florian teaches in the Master Course in International Health and various TropEd Short Courses mainly HIV AIDS related topics, Tuberculosis, Poverty and Equity, and conducts training courses for health professionals e.g. in Yemen, Ethiopia, Vietnam. He is responsible for moderating and teaching jointly with Huzeifa Bodal (GIZ) a course on Health and Human Rights. In undergraduate teaching he is actively involved in the elective subject "Global Health", the "Georg Forster Society" and a preparatory seminar for student electives in developing countries. Externally he teaches at the MSc in Epidemiology at the University of Mainz and for the Academy for Global Health and development (<http://www.agge-akademie.de/>). He supervises respective co-supervises MSc candidates and PhD candidates.

### **Research**

Florian's main research topics are HIV/Aids and non-communicable diseases, in particular diabetes.
