PROPOSAL WRITING AS A CONSULTANCY SKILL

PROPOSAL WRITING AS A CONSULTANCY SKILL

Content Overview

This course provides practical knowledge and experience in writing funding proposals, in developing essential global health consultancy skills and the do's and don'ts of working in the international arena.

It gives participants an introduction to consultancy and current trends in international cooperation and enables them to apply concepts and principles of proposal writing, development and design within the context of international health.

Participants learn about proposal formulation according to the rules of an international donor and how to use analytical and design tools such as situational analysis and log-frames. The course also focuses on improving participants' personal writing skills.

Main Topics

- Proposal writing techniques
- Using analytical and design tools
- Criteria for proposal evaluation
- Understanding international donors

Target Group

Public health professionals, project planners and managers, paramedical staff, social scientists, tropEd students, global health consultants, Ministries of Health, development partners.

Prerequisites

This course is held in English. Excellent command/ high level of proficiency in reading, writing and speaking English is required. Some experience in writing project proposals is desirable.

Learning Objectives

By the end of this course participants will be able to:

- Develop and write a proposal targeting international health donors
- Apply the principles of effective proposal writing using analytical and design tools.
- Utilise the team approach to developing a proposal
- Use criteria for assessment of proposals

Teaching and Assessment

This course uses case studies, proposal documents and experience from low- and middle-income countries, with contributions from participants of the course to demonstrate the universal applicability of the concepts and principles. This includes learning based on lectures (15 hrs), individual reading and exercise (15 hrs), plenary discussions and group exercises (4 hrs), facilitated proposal writing (20 hrs) and peer assessment (6 hrs).

Course participants are expected to attend teaching sessions full-time and participate actively in discussions and group assignments.

Participants' learning will be assessed on:

- Facilitator assessed group proposal (70%)
- Peer assessed group proposal (30%)

The short courses programme offered by the Heidelberg Institute of Global Health at Heidelberg University provides opportunities for continuing education and professional development. Short courses are open to the Institute's postgraduate students, students from other tropEd member institutions, and health professionals wanting to specialise or expand their knowledge in a particular subject area in international health.
