## **Getting to Heildelberg**

The central location of Heidelberg makes travelling easy with all modes of transport.

#### **RAIL**

Heidelberg is well connected to the European long distance network, as well a the Deutsche Bahn (German Rail's) ICE and IC/EC (high speed) network including international connections to Amsterdam, Brussels, and Paris (<a href="https://www.bahn.de">www.bahn.de</a>).

Within the region and across its borders, too, the Rhine-Neckar Transport Association ensures the best connections with the S-Bahn (town/city center and suburban rail) (www.vrn.de).

#### **AIRPORTS**

Frankfurt International Airport (FRA; ca. 80km) with direct high-speed train connection from within the airport (ca. 60min), City Airport Mannheim (approx. 18km), Baden-Airpark or Karlsruhe/Baden-Baden Airport (approx. 90km), Stuttgart Airport (approx. 120km), Frankfurt Hahn Airport (approx. 150km).





#### Venue

The course will be held at the IWH (Internationales Wissenschaftsforum Heidelberg). The IWH is a centre for scholarly exchange in all areas of science and was established on the occasion of the 600<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Heidelberg University in 1986.

Since then it has been sponsored by Heidelberg University and is open for scientific conferences or workshops organized by university staff. It is located in the heart of the old town, providing opportunities for discussion of science objectives and cruise logistics in an informal setting.

Coffee breaks as well as lunch will take place in the dining room next to the meeting facilities or alternatively in the garden (pending on weather forecast).
