

DECISION-MAKING IN PUBLIC HEALTH: EVIDENCE, POLITICS OR DIPLOMACY

DECISION-MAKING IN PUBLIC HEALTH: EVIDENCE, POLITICS OR DIPLOMACY

Content Overview

This course provides participants with necessary tools to develop evidence-informed decisions in health. It aims to equip participants with skills to systematically assess and critically appraise existing information and develop evidence-based technical overviews.

Course participants learn how to provide evidence for their own managerial decision-making and how to communicate and translate such evidence into the process of changing and improving policy and practice.

The course identifies different decision-making approaches in health practice and raises awareness for the different motives of stakeholders involved in decision-making processes.

Main Topics

- Development and implementation of evidence-informed decisions in health
- Different approaches of decision-making in health
- Methods and tools that increase evidence relevance for practice

Target Group

Public health professionals, project planners and managers, paramedical staff, social scientists, tropEd students.

Prerequisites

This course is held in English. Excellent command/ high level of proficiency in reading, writing and speaking English is required.

Learning Objectives

By the end of this course students will be able to:

- Establish and critically discuss evidence-informed concepts and identify different approaches for health policy decisions
- Develop strategies for evidence-based decision-making and pertinent evidence-informed decisions on a given problem in the field of health, including prioritization of information, critical appraisal and synthesis of information
- Identify and involve stakeholders influencing health research, policy and practice

Teaching and Assessment

This course aims to initiate an active participatory learning process. It uses a mixture of interactive lectures, individual assignments, case studies, group work and presentations, and a panel debate. Key facts and concepts are addressed in the interactive lectures. Individual reading assignments deepen this knowledge and case studies are used for better understanding and analysing processes at work in the dynamics between evidence, policy and practice.

Course participants are expected to attend teaching sessions full-time and participate actively in discussions and group assignments.

Participants' learning will be assessed on:

- Individual written assignment (essay) 2500 words (60%)
- Oral presentation based on group work (40%)

IN INTERNATIONAL HEALTH / tropEd

The short courses programme offered by the Heidelberg Institute of Global Health at Heidelberg University provides opportunities for continuing education and professional development. Short courses are open to the Institute's postgraduate students, students from other tropEd member institutions, and health professionals wanting to specialise or expand their knowledge in a particular subject area in international health.

SHORT COURSES
