PUBLIC HEALTH AND DISASTERS: ASSESSING AND RESPONDING TO HEALTH CARE NEEDS IN NATURAL DISASTERS AND COMPLEX EMERGENCIES

Content Overview

This course focuses on understanding health and health system impacts as well as health care needs in natural disasters (e.g. floods, earthquakes) and complex emergencies (e.g. armed conflicts). It looks at the role of public health in disaster situations, disaster preparedness and response, needs assessment methods and prioritisation.

This course aims to create awareness about the relief and development context in which international organisations work as well as the driving forces and determinants of inter-agency coordination in the field.

Main Topics

- Disaster situations, preparedness and management programmes
- Applied epidemiology
- Relief planning and management of natural disasters and complex emergencies

Target Group

Public health professionals, project planners and managers, paramedical staff, social scientists, and tropEd students.

Prerequisites

This course is held in English. Excellent command/ high level of proficiency in reading, writing and speaking English is required.

Learning Objectives

By the end of this course participants will be able to:

- Explain the health and health systems impacts of

- disasters

 Explain the importance of addressing gender-based
- Explain the importance of addressing gender-based violence and mental health impacts
- Differentiate between natural disasters and complex emergencies in terms of health impacts and needs
- Apply rapid needs assessment methods and prioritisation in disaster situations
- Use strategic and operational planning and health management tools as well as epidemiological methods in disaster situations
- Explain the driving forces and determinants of inter-agency coordination in the field
- Develop a concept for development-oriented humanitarian aid and mainstreaming preparedness in development policies
- Handle socio-cultural aspects in the field appropriately

Teaching and Assessment

This course combines lectures, case studies, group and individual practical exercises. Course participants are expected to attend all teaching sessions full-time and actively participate in class discussions and group work.

Participants' learning will be assessed on:

- Final exam: short essay and multiple choice questions (70%)
- Group presentation (30%)

The short courses programme offered by the Heidelberg Institute of Global Health at Heidelberg University provides opportunities for continuing education and professional development. All short courses are open to the Institute's postgraduate students, students from other tropEd member institutions, and health professionals wanting to specialise or expand their knowledge in a particular subject area in international health.
