

## Workshop

### Temporality, Corporeality und Intersubjectivity

September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2018

The German Society for Phenomenological Anthropology, Psychiatry, and Psychotherapy (DGAP) invites to a one-day workshop.

The significance of temporality in the field of phenomenology is hardly disputable and the prevalence of conceptions of corporal intersubjectivity has long exceeded the borders of philosophical theorizing. Nonetheless, approaches linking these two central constituents of human self- and world-relation have remained largely rudimentary. This omission is all the more surprising given that the connection not only crystallizes as early as in infantile interaction patterns but is also fundamental for a manifold of practices, including intersubjective synchronization. The phenomena occurring when individual and universal time fall apart (desynchronisation) indicate the need for a deeper understanding of temporality and corporeality also in the domains of psychiatry and psychotherapy.

This year's DGAP workshop addresses the complexity of the multifarious interrelations of temporality, corporeality and intersubjectivity: How to define these interrelations from a phenomenological perspective? What to infer from such definitions for the human self- and world-relations? What conclusions are to be drawn with regard to psychopathological and psychotherapeutic research? How to discern significant differences due to enculturational variations?

This Call for Abstracts invites postgraduate students, doctoral candidates and postdocs of all relevant disciplines to contribute to the debate. Detailed abstracts have to be submitted by **July 08<sup>th</sup>** to [icp@wts.uni-heidelberg.de](mailto:icp@wts.uni-heidelberg.de). Submissions may be in English or German and should not exceed **300 words**. All participants will give a short presentation up to 20 minutes in order to permit an intensive discussion afterwards. Work in progress (e.g. master or doctoral thesis) may be presented. Submitted abstracts will be peer-reviewed by **July 15<sup>th</sup>**. Invited contributors should send drafts (with a maximum of ten pages) by **August 27<sup>th</sup>**, so that a preliminary reader can be provided. Moreover, all participants are invited to take part in the conference [“Time, the Body, and the Other”](#) following on September 13<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup>, 2018, at a reduced early registration fee (Phd conference pass) (free admission will be considered). Invited papers will be published in the open-access journal [InterCultural Philosophy](#).
